Overview

This is our eleventh year working with this amazing implementing partner! The project is providing communities, local schools and individual families in rural Cambodia with access to safe and clean water. Each year the project provides, on average, 10 pump wells, 250 clay water filters and 7 schools with latrines and wash points. The recipients also receive vital hygiene and sanitation education. This project is providing thousands of individuals with access to safe, clean water at an average cost of \$8 per person!

Impact for March - August 2023



Construction of three water sources

was completed at three schools during the reporting period. These were either wells or ponds and formed part of the SWASH-E program. They provide reliable water for latrines and wash points.

SWASH-E (School WASH Education)

programs have been conducted in three schools where ponds/wells were constructed, impacting 1350 people. SWASH-E groups were formed to support and reinforce sanitation education. And 12 latrines were built for the three schools.

Community WASH education

Has been delivered to the broader community. 1850 members of the community were direct beneficiaries of this program.

100 clay pot water filters were distributed

to schools and households, on average helping 500 people. Along with latrines, wells and WASH education, filters are vital to providing clean, safe water and in particular are a simple source of clean drinking water.



- The school directors, teachers and villagers assist with digging wells and construction. This gives them the knowledge to duplicate and repair/maintain systems.
- Teachers carry out the basic hygiene and sanitation lessons. The students are applying their knowledge of health and sanitation at school and in their homes
- The community contributes 50% of the costs, helping them to stay engaged and take responsibility for their own health and future, as well as encouraging unity to achieve shared goals.



Say Sakorn's Story

As vice principal of Bunrany Hunsen Phnom Jiso High School, I am so pleased to tell you about our new latrines! Before we became part of the project, we had nothing. It was very difficult for both students and teachers needing to use the toilet during school hours. They used bushes instead. The latrines and wash basins have made school life so much more convenient. Students have learned about regular handwashing and are putting it into practice at school. Homeroom teachers have set up a cleaning roster to share daily cleaning. Thank you so much for helping our school.
