Overview

This project is located in the far north-east of Thailand in rural villages and towns near Chiang Rai. The project provides HIV/AIDS and drug awareness education programs in Thai rural schools, prisons and communities together with simple income-generating projects to support families from the school who are afflicted by disease, and other poor families. By educating and supporting affected families with health education and income-generating projects such as chickens and pigs, it allows children to be kept in school, in a family and in a community. Year 1 budget \$17,500.

Why support this:

Our partners have worked in this area for over 25 years and have a proven track record in the community. Relationships have been built and consolidated over a long time. Our partners are well networked with local Thai government departments and other NGOs (nongovernment organisations) in the area. Memorandums of Understanding are in place with local detention and rehabilitation centres, schools and other community groups. Income-generating projects give families a way to stay together and to support themselves and send children to school.

Objectives Include:



6 education programs in prisons per yer



6 youth detention education programs



20 education programs in schools per year



13 incomegeneration projects annually

Expected life change

- Economic empowerment of the family in a community setting allows children to grow up in a more stable environment, to have better nutrition and to attend school
- Simple income-generating projects encourage families to become productive members of their own community
- Education on HIV/AIDS/drug awareness empowers children to protect themselves from predatory harm and behaviours
