#### **Overview**

This project builds on previous Entrust support to fight human trafficking. It leverages relationships with Thai law enforcement, antitrafficking organisations and faith communities to make targeted impact in preventing child trafficking in a major hot spot. Prevention campaigns will target migrant children, villages/schools in northern and eastern Thailand and schools in urban areas. The project supports outreach events together with three Trafficking Prevention staff. It will continue to optimise its on-line presence as traffickers shift their methods to coerce and trap children.

## Training of Leadership students as advocates

Entrust's partnership enables the Prevention Team staff to equip their Leadership students. Student relationships often facilitate the connection with remote communities, resulting in more advocates from rural areas as students graduate and return to these locations.



- New relationships are being formed outside of Chiang Mai and Mae Hong Son. There are possibilities to expand the outreach program into the province of Kanchanaburi (western Thailand) and the Isaan region (eastern Thailand). There have been two outreaches in Mae Sot, near the Myanmar border, for the first time in six years.
- Pastors, school officials, village leaders and prominent officials have been empowered by outreaches, training and investigation assistance and continue to request further support to help prevent trafficking.
