Overview

Mondulkiri province, located in Cambodia's north-eastern highlands, is home to many indigenous communities, particularly the Bunong people. These communities face deep poverty, high levels of violence, low school engagement, and rising rates of adolescent pregnancy. Our partner is committed to equipping the most vulnerable households to drive positive change from within. This project aims to strengthen the economic stability of at-risk Bunong families and build community knowledge and capacity to better protect women, children, and young people.

Why Support This:

The project focuses on two transformative areas, economic empowerment and community safeguarding, across seven villages in this region. To strengthen livelihoods, Bunong farmers and households will be equipped to grow high-value horticultural crops using sustainable methods, while young people will gain entrepreneurship, life skills, and financial literacy training to broaden their future opportunities. In addition, the project will enhance safety and protection for Bunong women and children by increasing awareness of risks such as sexual and gender-based violence (GBV), human trafficking, and online exploitation. Community members, local authorities, and service providers will receive training to identify harm, respond effectively, and support survivors of GBV.
